The Why of Obedience

Obey: to follow the commands or guidance of.

Do you struggle with the idea of the word obey? I think most of us would have a bit of an issue when it comes to obeying. Why? Because to obey someone is to submit to their plan. This means we give up our plan and follow them. Submission doesn't come easy for us humans. So why do we choose to obey? One is for the reward involved. Another reason is for consequences that will come. Reward and consequence can be strong motivators in why we do what we do. I like to think of this type of submission as result-based obedience.

Although reward and consequence can be an influence in our life of obedience, I have found that it doesn't always work. There is a problem with result-based obedience. This form of obedience is focused on self. We only obey because of what we get or don't get. The whole idea of obedience in this capacity is selfcentred. Sometimes the reward or consequence will not be great enough for a person to choose obedience. At this point they choose their own plan over the one in authority. This produces the opposite of obedience, disobedience. Have you ever experienced this in your Christian walk? Unfortunately, I have. Disobedience seems to be a theme in my journey. There has to be a better way than result-based obedience.

If result-based obedience doesn't work, then what is the answer as to why we obey? Here is what Jesus says in John 14:23,

Jesus replied, "Anyone who loves me will obey my teaching. My Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them

Obedience works best when it is relationship-based. If our motivation to obey is driven by genuine affection and appreciation, then we obey for a very different reason. Relationship-based obedience is selfless not selfish. We are no longer doing what we do for a result, we do it to honour and respect the person we serve. This reshapes how we measure obedience. Submission is no longer about what we can get from obeying, yet it is about what we are giving by obeying. We give our King great joy in our obedience. We give our King a great testimony when we obey. Relationship-based obedience longs for others to see our

incredible God and knowing God will be delighted in our choices.

Relationship-based obedience is what Christ desires for us. However, like all the ways of Jesus, it is challenging and confronting. Could I invite you to start by examining your reason for obedience? Pray about becoming more relationship-based instead of result-based. Start working toward an obedience that is motivated by a heart of gratitude. An obedience that is determined to see the one we serve honored and glorified through our faithful actions.

Join me Sunday as we keep looking at the idea of how we start 2024. I think we will find obedience is a vital part of that journey.

- Continue to pray for all those in our church family who are battling illness. May God's healing and peace fill them and their families during this difficult time




