Luke 22:61-62


This Sunday we are looking at our last encounter with the Good Shepherd. Jesus has dealt with Mary's despair, the two disciples' anxiety as they travelled to Emmaus, and last week Thomas' doubt. This week we find Jesus on the shores of defeat. Peter had done the one thing he vowed to never do and that was deny his Lord. Now, as a failure, he is unsure what to do with

Have you ever felt like a failure? It is a very disheartening feeling. When we make a mistake, the enemy makes sure we don't forget it. Our mistakes make us feel like failures, they bring us to a place where we become totally defeated. Here is the problem with one who is defeated. They see no hope. All the time they invested into achieving the goal seems wasted. All the efforts to learn and train in an area seems useless. The other things they sacrificed to achieve this goal was absolutely in vain. A person who is defeated simply packs up their dreams and walks away. It is a horrible place to be.

This is exactly where Jesus found Peter. Peter was living in a defeated mindset. Can you imagine what Peter was going through? He probably heard those words, "I DON'T KNOW THE MAN!" over and over in his mind. Every time a rooster would crow, he most likely would see the eyes of Jesus piercing into his soul. He undoubtedly played those moments over and over in his mind and each time felt the pang of regret. Defeat always makes us look back and think about what we could have done differently. Yet, here is the reality. Peter couldn't change the past; he needed to move forward. Peter needed to realise that his mistakes were why Jesus had come in the first place. Peter needed to embrace the power of forgiveness in his life. It is in the assurance of forgiveness that we will find the passion to keep going. Forgiveness not only releases us from our mistakes, but forgiveness also reinstates us for our future. Yes, when we walk in the forgiving grace of our Lord, we shake off the mistakes, learn a valued lesson and keep moving forward for his glory.

I am sure we can all relate to Peter. I know I have certainly made mistakes when it comes to following Jesus. How about you? If the truth is known, right now there are people in our church family who are unwilling to be involved because they feel like a failure. Individuals who are living with shame and regret. which is causing them to be defeated. I pray this Sunday you too can experience the joy of our Lord's forgiveness. It is time for us to start feeding the sheep instead of feeding the fish.


